Measure Frequency

We have had several clients request additional measure frequency options. We listened and added the following options to report on data:

- Every six months
- Every two years
- Every five years

For those curious on the longer term measures are often ones in health care that are collected and reported by outside organizations. They are helpful to have on dashboards as they are often related to specific initiative's and/or programs underway.

Our clients requested an additional layout, so they could incorporate additional horizontal images or charts. Included this release is a new image option that allows a horizontal footprint with a small text box below it that will allow two lines of text set at a 16 point font.

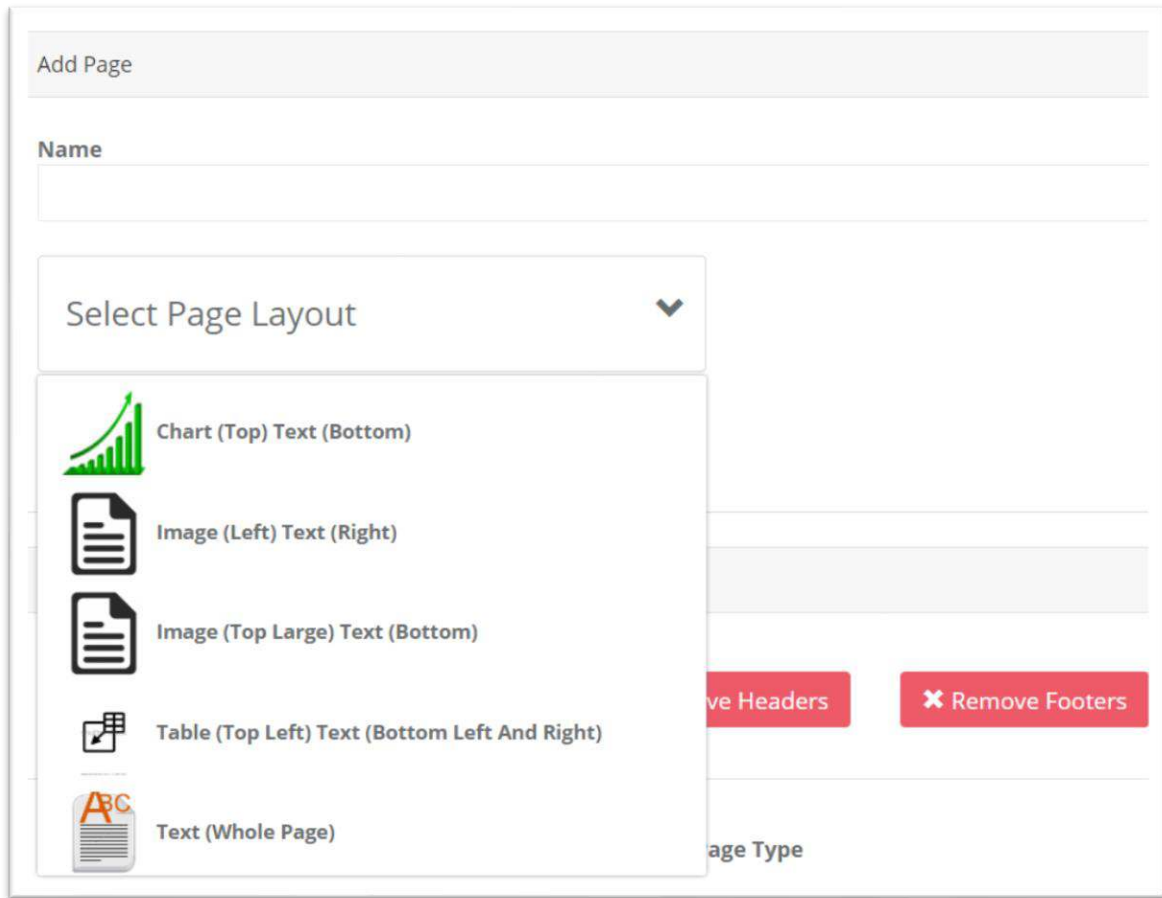


Figure 2: Additional layout option - Image (Top Large) Text (Bottom)

Projects – Now can delete

Our original thinking was that most organizations would prefer archiving projects vs deleting them. What we did not anticipate is that it users like to practice using the functionality and when done the best option is to delete the training projects. Administrator or project owner can now delete the project.

The second dashboard allows you to see who is set up as RESULTS users in your organization. You can filter, sort, and export the information including their email addresses allowing you to quickly send out important information to your user base.
